MEDAL OF HONOR CEREMONY CONTINUED:

THE PRESIDENT:

You and your party will be escorted from your office at 10:00 a.m. Ruffles and Flourishes will be played as you pause at the edge of the terrace and then "Hail to the Chief" as you are escorted down the path and along the driveway. Specialist Four Kinsman will be to your right with Chief Warrant Officer Ferguson in turn to his right. You will be followed by the Secretary of Defense, Secretary of the Army and the Vice Chief of Staff of the Army. The band will cease playing as you reach the red carpet.

When you mount the review stand you will move to the front with the recipients maintaining their same relative positions to your right. The Commander of Troops will bring the Honor Guard to PRESENT ARMS, ORDER ARMS, salute and report, "Mr. President, the honor guard is formed." You will acknowledge the report with a brief nod.

The Color Guard will move forward and the two recipients will descend from the platform and take up position in front of the Color Guard. You will stand fast. The Commander of Troops will salute and report, "Mr. President, the persons to be decorated are present." You will acknowledge this with a nod.

The National Anthem will be played and you will salute.

At the conclusion of the National Anthem you will move to your left and to the rear, taking up position to the right of the microphone. Chief Warrant Officer Ferguson will remount the reviewing stand and take up position in front of you. You will be facing forward with your left side to the press corps.

MEDAL OF HONOR CEREMONY CONTINUED:

THE PRESIDENT:

NOTE:

There will be full press coverage of the ceremony.

When Chief Warrant Officer Ferguson is in position, the Secretary of the Army will read the Citation. While the Citation is being read an Armed Forces Aide will hand you the Congressional Medal of Honor. You will put this around the recipient's neck and step back. At the conclusion of the reading you will shake hands and congratulate Chief Warrant Officer Ferguson, who will move back to his original position on the reviewing stand.

Specialist Four Thomas J. Kinsman will then mount the reviewing stand and you will repeat the presentation ceremony. When this is accomplished, you and the recipient will return to your original positions on the reviewing stand.

After the Color Guard has returned to its original position the Commander of Troops will command PRESENT ARMS, STAFF PRESENT ARMS. You will acknowledge with a nod and then the Commander of Troops will command ORDER ARMS, salute and report, "Mr. President, this concludes the ceremony."

The troops will be given PARADE REST and you will then step to the microphone to deliver brief remarks. The recipients will move to a position to your right and slightly to the rear and the Secretary of Defense, Secretary of the Army and Vice Chief of Staff of the Army will take position behind them.

ATTACK CARRIER STRIKING GROUP VISIT

Saturday, May 17, 1969

1:00 Complete full military honors.

You will be escorted to a seat on the flight deck of the carrier to observe the anti-air warfare fire power demonstration. Talos, Terrier and Tartar surface-to-air missiles will be fired against drone jet aircraft by ships in company.

1:05 Concurrent with anti-air warfare power demonstration, the nuclear attack submarine HADDO will make a run close aboard partially submerged and will fire a live SUBROC (ASW) missile.

1:30 Complete anti-air warfare .

Note: USS SAMPSON (DDG-10) will come alongside for a 5 to 7 minute narrative description of a guided missile destroyer if a lull occurs in missile firing.

Note: During the missile firing demonstration, you will be introduced to several enlisted petty officers, junior officers, and pilots from the SARATOGA. These men will represent all departments from the ship and the Air Group. The pilots will be in their flight gear and will be the ones who will be in the airshow.

1:31 SARATOGA, SAMPSON and SEMMES clear formation and prepare for air fire power demonstration.

You will move to the Flag Bridge to observe the launch and token recovery of aircraft.

1:40 Launch aircraft. Recover six aircraft after the launch.

2:10 You will be escorted up one level to the Commanding Officer's Tactical Plot to meet the Commanding Officer and receive a very short brief in the Plot. You will then be escorted back to the Flight Deck for the airshow.

2:20 AIR DEMONSTRATION

1. Fly-by of the E2A Grumman Hawkeye early-warning aircraft.
2. Supersonic fly-by demonstrating sonic boom by F4 (McConnell Phantom all-weather attack fighter) and RA5C (North American reconnaissance-attack) aircraft.
3. A7 (LTV Corsair light attack aircraft) napalm drop.
4. A7 over the shoulder loft bomb delivery.
5. A7 low angle loft bomb delivery.
6. Level systems bomb delivery simulating night attack.
7. F4 air to ground rocket attack.
8. A7 45-degree dive bomb attack.
9. RA5C dual fly-by demonstrating low speed and high speed capabilities of a single aircraft.
10. Sidewinder missile attack showing air-to-air capabilities.
11. A7 strafing attack.
12. F4 snap-up intercept demonstrating ability of fighter aircraft to pursue and intercept enemy aircraft.
13. Demonstration of in-flight refueling capability. KA3 tanker in-flight refueling of F4, A6 and A7.
14. BULLPUP (missile) attack.
15. Demonstration of coordinated bomb delivery.
16. Salute to the President.
17. Fly-by.

(There will be a 5-minute delay before the fly-by where you could shake hands with some members of the crew.)

Note: During the airshow, you will have an opportunity to mingle and meet members of the flight deck crew. These men, in their colorful jerseys, perform the very dangerous and demanding duty of coordinating all aircraft starts, taxiing, catapult hook-ups, launches, and recoveries. They will be grouped in your area

You will address the crew and express your appreciation for the demonstration. Your remarks will be transmitted to and amplified on all ships in the formation for all crews to hear.

At 10:40 a. m. you will be escorted from your office to the edge of the terrace outside your office. Four ruffles and flourishes will be played. As "Hail to the Chief" is played, you will be escorted to the vicinity of the platform on the South Lawn. A few moments later, the car carrying His Excellency Petrus J. S. de Jong, Prime Minister of the Netherlands, and His Excellency Joseph M. A. H. Luns, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Netherlands, will pull up to the Diplomatic Entrance of the Residence. The Chief of Protocol will present the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs to you and then to Acting Secretary of State Elliot L. Richardson and General Westmoreland, Chief of Staff of the United States Army.

NOTE:

There will be photo coverage of your greeting your honored guests.

Following the photographs, you will escort your honored guests onto the platform with the Prime Minister to your right and the Foreign Minister to your left facing toward the Washington Monument.

The Commander of Troops, positioned in front of you, will bring the Honor Guard to Present Arms and salute. Following four ruffles and flourishes, the band will play the national anthems of the Netherlands and the United States and a 19-gun salute will be fired simultaneously with the music.

Upon completion of honors, the Commander will give the troop Order Arms, salute, and report, "Sir, the Honor Guard is formed."

You will then escort Prime Minister de Jong (with him to your right) toward the band. The Foreign Minister and Colonel Hughes will follow. The Commander of Troops will take position to the right of the Prime Minister and as you turn in front of the band, you will take position to the right of the Commander of Troops.

The Commander will guide the party through the inspection, beginning at the right of the band, passing along the front rank of troops to the left flank of the Honor Guard and then around the rear of the formation and back to the starting point at the right front of the band.

At 3:00 P. M. you will be escorted from your office to the Cabinet Room where you will be greeted by Mr. Cornelius J. Ryan, author, and Roving Editor of the Reader's Digest. He, in turn, will introduce you to the other correspondents present who covered the D-Day landings in Normandy twenty five years ago. A list of the correspondents and supporting personnel is attached.

After you have greeted the group, you will be seated and Mr. Ryan will brief you on what the group plans to do on its return to France.

At the conclusion of the discussion you and your guests will be escorted to the Rose Garden for a group photograph taken by a White House photographer.

NOTE: This will also be a photo opportunity for the press corps.

It is estimated your participation will be of 15-20 minutes' duration at the conclusion of which you will be escorted back to your office.

BACKGROUND:

- General Omar Bradley will participate in the observance in Europe.
- Pan American World Airways is providing the transportation for the group.
- The group departs for Europe tomorrow.
