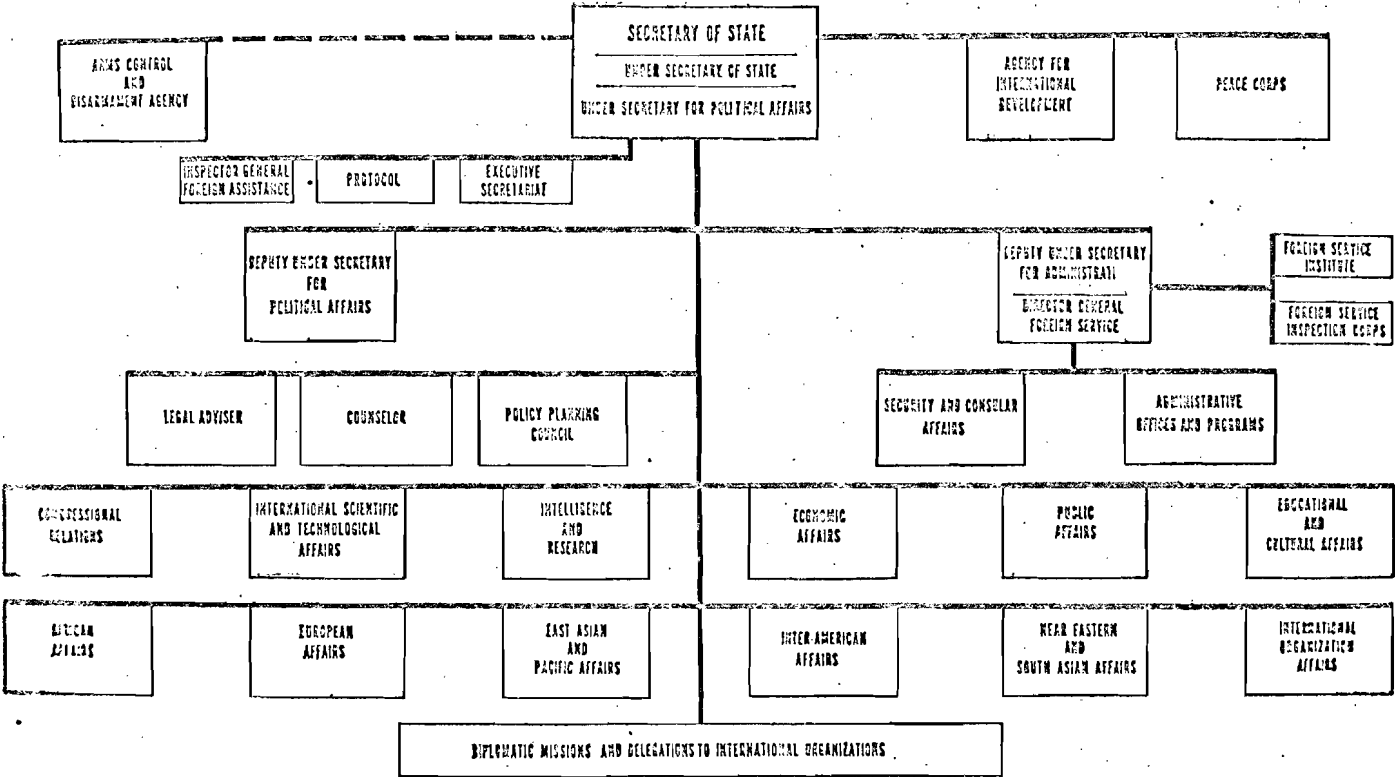

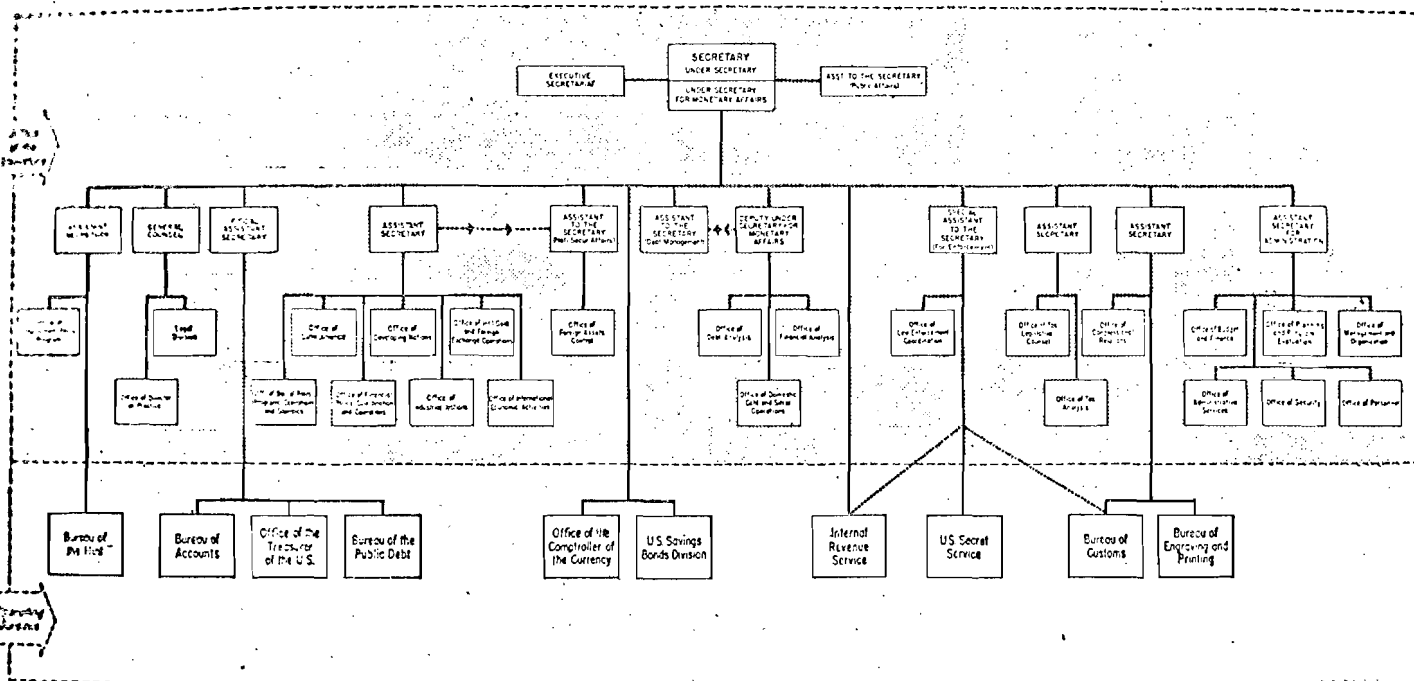

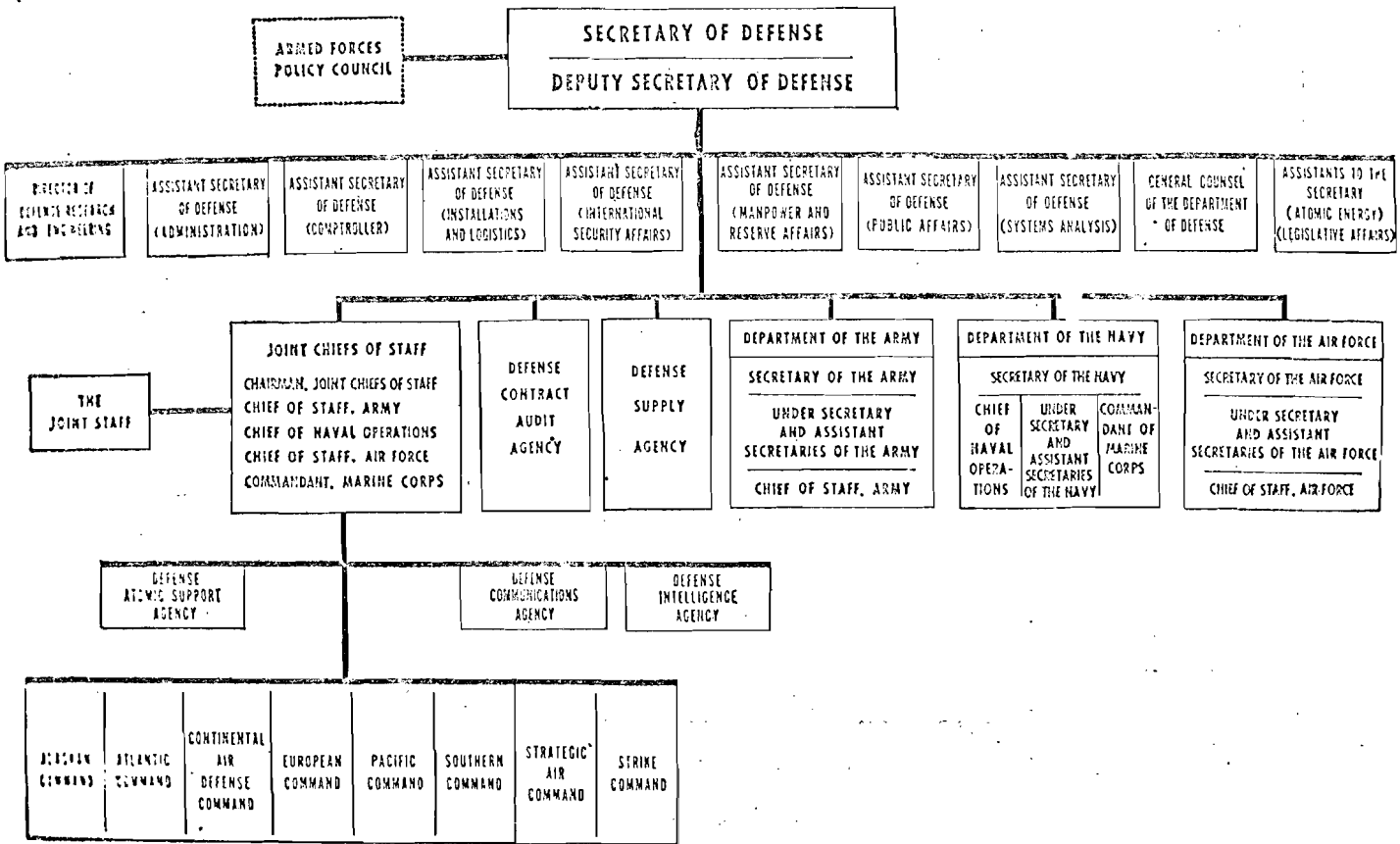

ORGANIZATION CHARTS



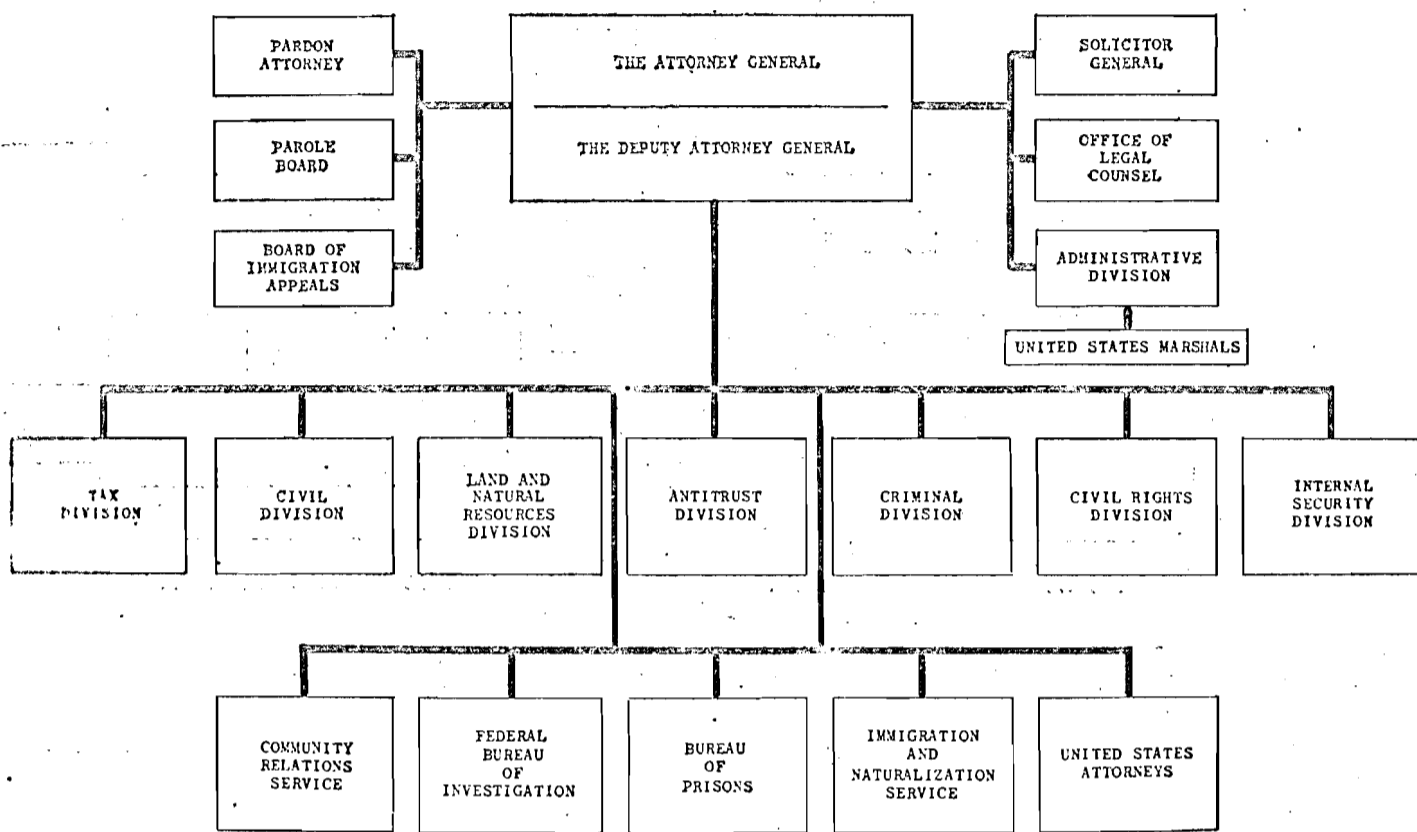

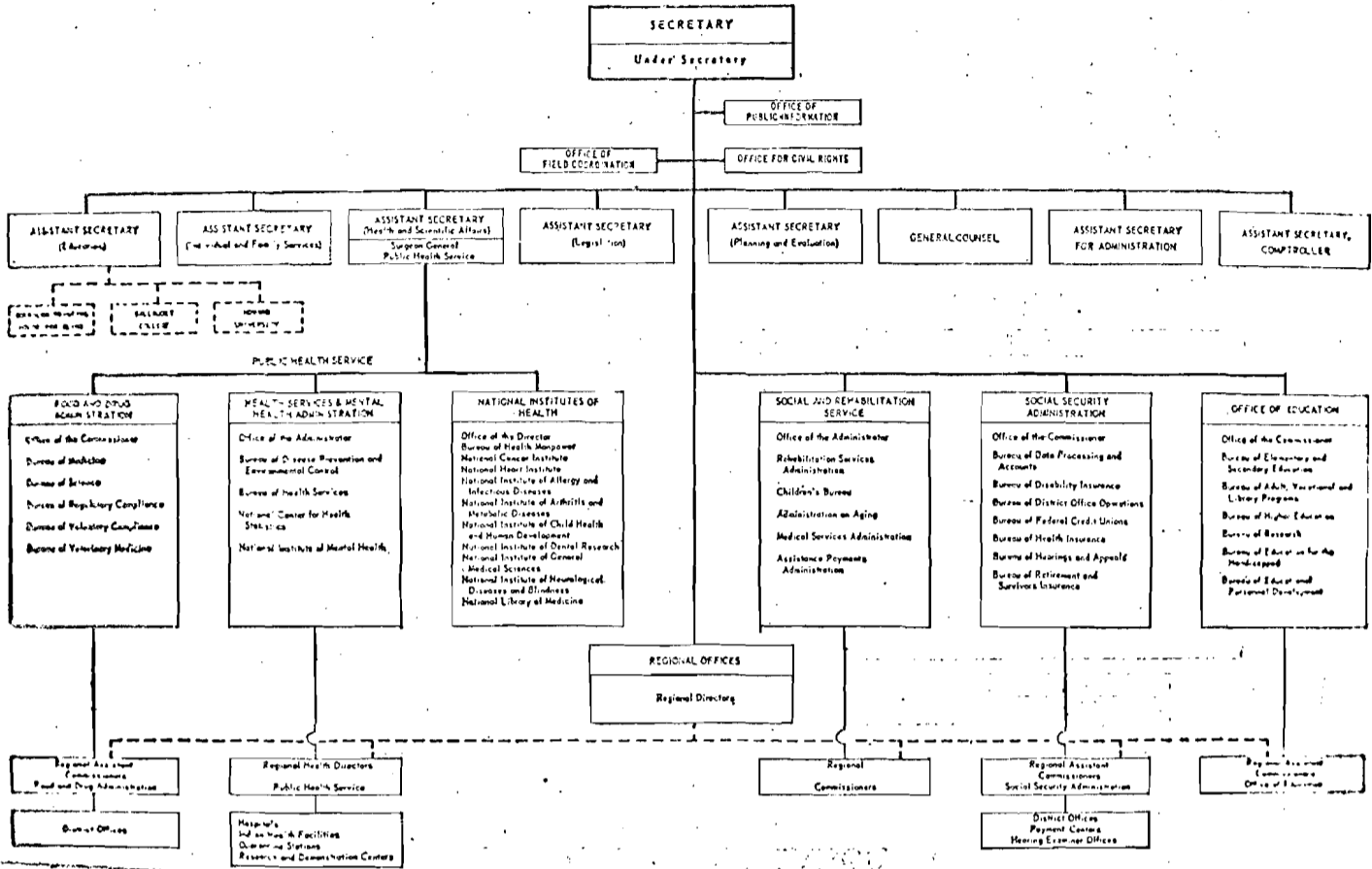

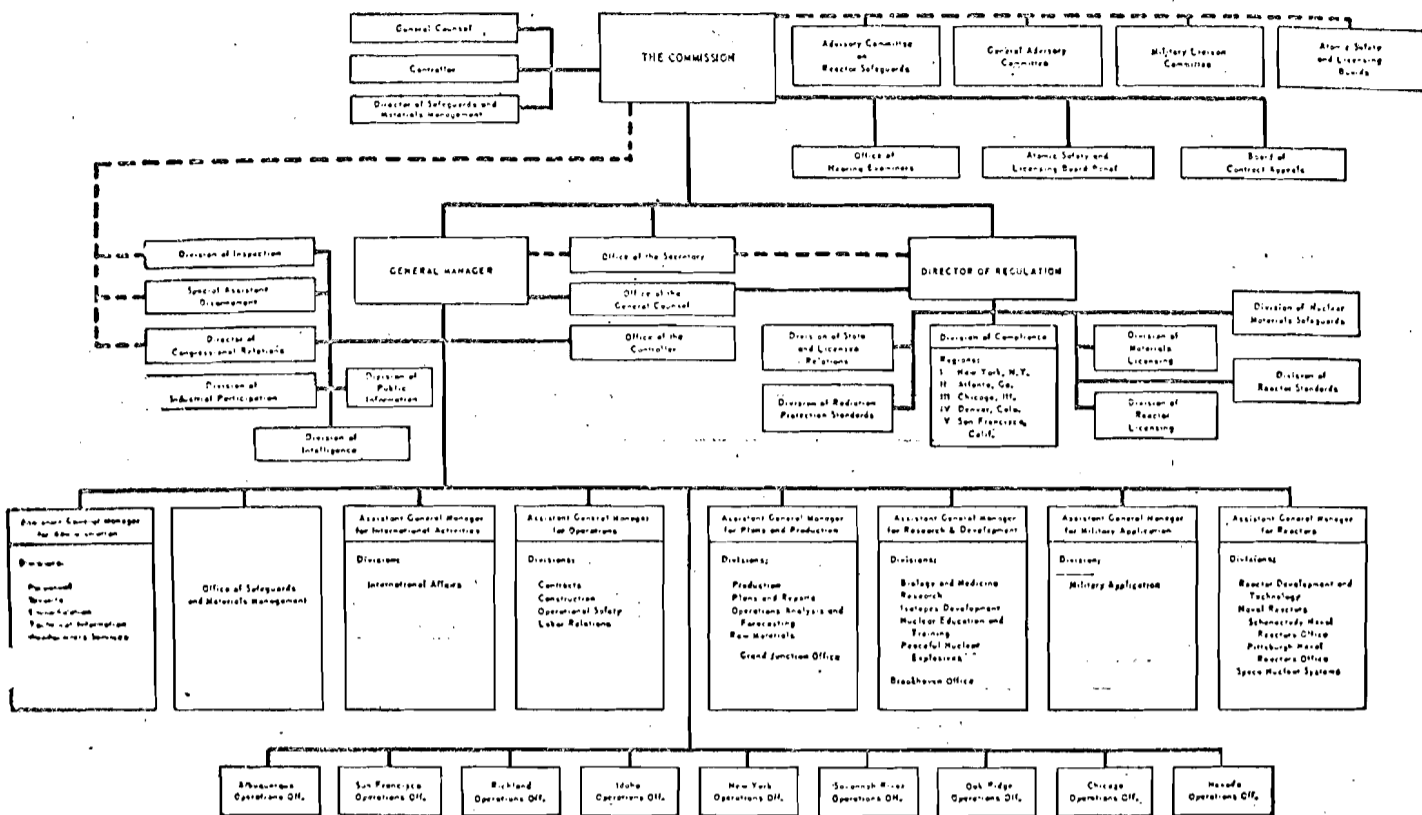

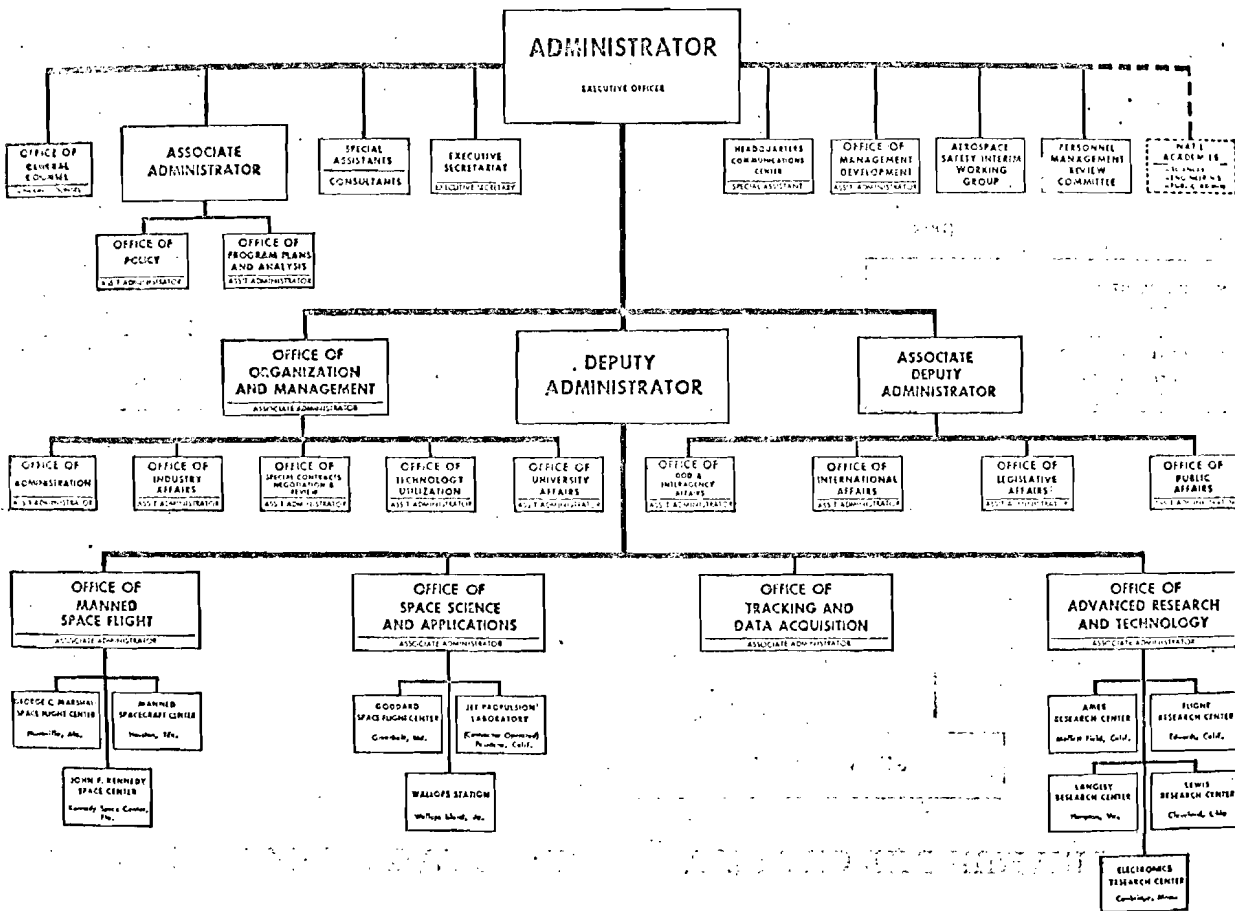


ORGANIZATION CHARTS
