Mr. Nason informs me that he will make arrangements with Mr. Jones on all of the above.

I know that the above is not too comforting to you; therefore, we will follow up with Nason tomorrow morning.

MEMORANDUM FOR H.R. HALDEMAN

Regarding the General Beadle College speech, Herb Klein reports that a lower echelon man in HEW raised the question of whether or not it was legal to use HEW franking privileges to mail out speeches to a list provided by the Republican National Committee. Rather than creating a story, Herb obtained private funds through Clem Stone and mailed the speech out to a RNC list of 11,000 professors and college presidents. The mailing included a letter from Bob Finch.
