Not that it matters greatly at this late date, but I enclose herewith a note to me from Kent Smith regarding some ads placed last year. Smith's letter is self-explanatory except that he omits the fact that he was originally told the cost of the ads would be equally divided among all signers of the ad.

Ironically, there appear to be no poor men on this ad; yet, of them, only Kent Smith has been a substantial contributor to us both in '68 and '70.

Whoever coordinated this thing from the White House owes some explanation to Smith, for while he is 100% with us this is a pretty good way to turn him off.

Larry - I do not know kent Smith - nor does his name appear an my list of persons sponsoring or even coordinating on ads. I shought I knew most of the people who were doing things on this scale, but this ad & this name are "strangers." (Miduitally, in Smith's letter to Sleeson, asthing is mentioned about an agreement that we would share costs - and I never agreed to such a thing. KENT H. SMITH woodstock road GATES MILLS, OHIO
