Dr. Derge and Tom Benham produced recommendations for a poll to assess the strengths of the Democratic contenders and the effect of third and fourth party candidates. Derge suggests running two ways and three way trial heats so that a cross-tabulation could "identify which persons shift to Wallace from RMN or the Democrats in a three-way race." Benham urges the use of the "familiarity/favorability" questions as well as fourth party options. If the questionnaire probed the two, three, and four way trial heats with Muskie, Kennedy, Humphrey and McGovern as the Democrats and Eugene McCarthy and Shirley Chisholm as the fourth party candidates, the polling would take two days and the results would be available on the third day.
