SUBJECT: White House Personnel Attending the
Republican National Convention

Attached is a list of White House personnel assigned to you whom I propose attend the Convention. The number of staff unfortunately must be limited due to budgetary, transportation and room constraints. The tone of the Convention is serious and working. Consequently, I must ask for your cooperation in keeping the number of White House personnel attending the Convention to a minimum.

The White House staff, Cabinet and Administration officials, and the Re-Election Committee staff will reside at the Doral-on-the-Ocean in Miami Beach.
