Secretary Laird has asked me to provide you with the following details with respect to the trip to the Army-Navy game with him and Mrs. Laird on Saturday, December 2nd. A special Train "W-2" is scheduled to depart Union Station for this purpose. In order to be seated and ready at departure time you should plan to arrive at Union Station no later than 7:30 a.m. The Secretary's cars will be appropriately marked and we will have people there to direct you to the proper car.

For your convenience, parking space has been arranged at the parking lot on the corner of First and D Streets N.E., Washington, D. C. The entrance to the parking lot is on First Street N.E. between D Street and Massachusetts Avenue, which is within easy walking distance of Union Station. If you use this parking arrangement, please place the enclosed card on the right hand corner of your windshield for ready identification.
