The President told the VP this morning -- he was in Watther Whittier College at the time -- he want back to see Whittier High School -- the auditorium at Whitter High School suffered such bad damage it had to be taken down. It was an auditorium in which the President had participated in oratorical debate contests, etc.

East Wittier Whittier School - grade school had to be torn down. school where the President had gone

His Aunt was living in Long Beach and he remembers riding down there to get her with his father.

Mostly he recalls the sound -- it is not just the shaking - it sounds like thunder
