During the past ten years the Association's day-to-day expenses have increased over sixty percent. In the present economic climate it has been necessary for us to adopt a budget for the 1969–1970 fiscal year in which we anticipate a further increase of approximately ten percent.

The Association must continue to increase the scope and effectiveness of its activities if it is to preserve its proud tradition and its responsible place in the community. Indeed, many of the economies we have been forced to adopt are even now beginning to affect adversely our efficiency and the maintenance of our House.

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

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XV. - NON-PAYMENT OF DUES

The names of those so stricken from the membership rolls by order of the Executive Committee for non-payment of dues may be published, by direction of the Executive Committee, in a list of members dropped for non-payment of dues in the annual report of the proceedings of the Association. But upon his written application, satisfactorily explaining the default, and upon payment of all dues to the date thereof the Executive Committee shall have power to remit the penalty of this By-Law.


Had we stayed at our former site, we would have had to practically rebuild the Clubhouse and try to design or rearrange a golf course — all subject to much higher school and real estate taxes.
