of Timahoe in the County of Kildare

To all people to whom this present deed of Settlement in bust shall come I John Millhouse of Timahoe in the County of Kildare Farmer sendeth greeting know ye that I the said John millhouse for and in consideration of the speciall Trust and confidence that I put & repose in my loving friend Alexander wyly of Gilltown in the said County of Kildare Farmer and in my loving & Trusty Friends & kinsmen John mickle of Killmucklane in the Kings County Farmer & Samuel mickle of Timahoe aforesaid Farmer and also in my dear & loving wife Sarah millhouse and also for and in consideration of the tender love & kindness I bear to & for my dear & loving wife and Children herein after mentioned and for & in consideration of five Shillings ster^t to me the said John millhouse in hand paid by the said Alloxander wyly and other my Trustees aforesaid: or some or one of them immediatly before the perfoming hereof the receipt whereof I doe hereby acknowledge have given granted confirmed assigned Transferred & sett over and by these presents doe give grant confirm assigne Transfor & sett over unto the said Alloxander wyly John Mickle Samuel Mickle and Sarah millhouse all my Estate Goods Chattolly Leases houses bonds bills Judgments Evidences & writings whatsoever ready money plate household goods and all other my Effects and Substance of what nature kind or sort soever the same be or may be found either in my own Custody or possession or in the Custody or possession of any other person or persons whatsoever at the time of my decease nothing excepted within the Kingdom of Ireland or Elsewhere to have and to hold receive & take the same unto the said Alloxander wyly and the rest of my Trustees aforesaid and to the Survivors and Survivor of them respectively to the severall & respective uses intents & purposes herein after mentioned and no other that is to say to the use of me the said John millhouse during the terme of My naturall life and from and after my decease all my Just debts being first satisfied and paid one third part of my whole Estate & Substance whatsoever shall goe to the use of my dear & loving wife Sarah millhouse and be held and Enjoyed by her and her heirs & assigns for ever and all the rest & residue of my whole Estate & Substance whatsoever shall goe to the use of my Children viz^t Thomas Mary Elizabeth Robert & Sarah millhouse or such of them as shall be living at the time of my decease and of any other Child or children of mine then unborn and shall be Equally divided amongst them share and share alike: and be paid

unto them at their respective Ages or days of marriage which shall first happen and if any of my children son or sons daughter or daughters shall happen to dye before they attaine their full age or be married then such child or childrens share or shares, part or parts shall goe to the use of and be equally ^{divided} amongst my surviving children and be paid unto them at their respective full ages or days of marriage as afforesaid Item that if any of my said children shall prove unduelifull by taking ill courses then my Trustees aboves named shall withhold from such child or children such part of his her or their portion or portions as they shall think fitt and give it to such of my children as are dutifull and more deserving Item that my said wife shall Educate and bring up my said children during her widowhood and be allowed for the same as my Trustees shall think fitt and if my said wife shall happen to marry that then my said Trustees and the survivor & survivor of them shall secure each childs part and portion for the generall & respective good of all my said children every way in wittness whereof I have as now unto put my hand & Seale the first day of the fifth month vulgarly called July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Tenn and then paid & delivered a milled Silver Sixpence to the said Alexander wyly being part and parcell of the afforesaid premises and have affixed and Enlosed the same in the Seale of this deed in lieu of the possession of the whole to the uses afforesaid

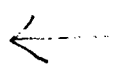

Nixon Has Wide Ohio Ancestry

LOGAN, Ohio (AP) — A sturdy tribe of Nixons in Hocking, Vinton and Perry counties will testify to the Ohio heritage of Republican presidential candidate Richard M. Nixon.

The former vice president's family roots go deep into the Southeastern Ohio hill country.

HIS GREAT-GREAT-grandfather, George Nixon, was 60 years old when he migrated from Virginia to Vinton County in 1844. One of his sons, George III, followed him to Ohio in 1852, became a Union soldier in the Civil War and was killed at Gettysburg in 1863, leaving a family of eight children.

One of those children was Samuel Brady Nixon who was 14 when his father was killed. At 26, he married the daughter of a neighboring storekeeper, Sarah Wadsworth, and they became the parents of Richard Nixon's father, Frank, and four other children.

SAMUEL NIXON remarried after Sarah died in 1886 and with his new wife, moved to Mount Pleasant on the Hocking-Vinton county line.

It was there that Richard Nixon's father grew up. In those years, the Nixons were all industrious hill farmers and Democrats, as were most of their neighbors.

Frank Nixon broke with family tradition and became a Republican during the McKinley presidential campaign.

FRANK NIXON was 23 when he moved to Columbus in 1901. He worked there six years as a streetcar operator, then moved in 1907 to Whittier, Calif.

He reared his family as Quakers and Republicans and lived to see his son become the U.S. vice president. He died in 1956.

The Nixon clan has multiplied mightily in this area with four of five branches in Hocking County alone.

IN 1960, RICHARD Nixon made two campaign trips by train through his father's native hills.

There is no report as yet just where all the Ohio Nixons stand in the present campaign, but it is a good bet that most of them will be voting for Nixon.

Dear Dr. Bell:

The number of people writing to claim relationship with the President has of course dropped considerably since the lively months following his Inauguration, but I know that Mrs. Humes will prove a faithful gatherer of the odd genealogical fact.

It has been a great pleasure for me to correspond with you during these last two and one-half years. Perhaps some day I will have the opportunity to meet you, and in the meantime I will be waiting for the news that you have succeeded in identifying Nixon ancestor number 10,000.

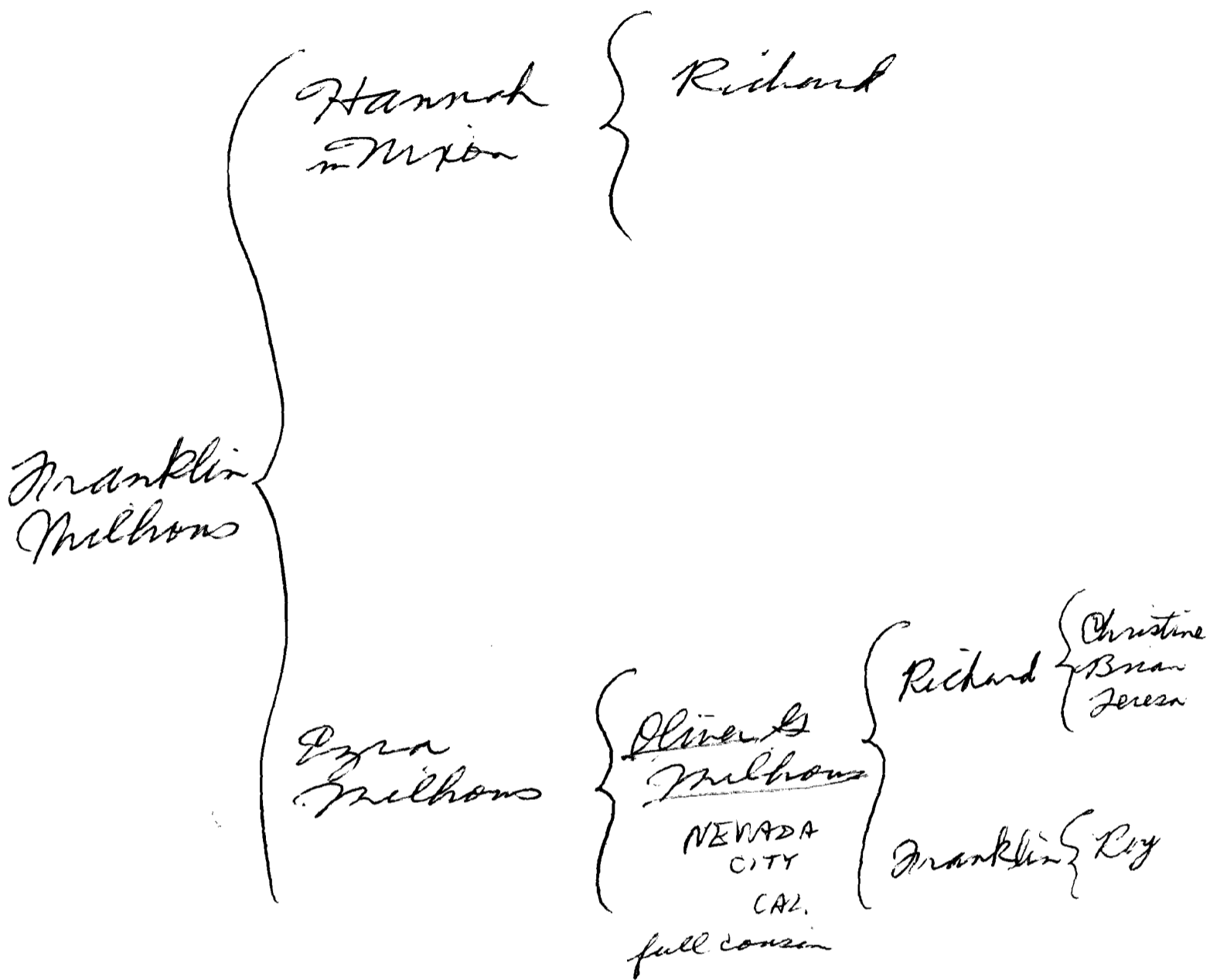
