

Bob Finch, privately, recommends a "no" vote even though he feels the initiative will be passed. Essentially this will place a ceiling on State expenditures, looks like a general decrease in expenditures and taxes, but throws a heavy financial burden on local government. He characterizes this as Governor Reagan's Presidential bid, an issue which he will use in the 1976 campaign.



MEASURE SUBMITTED TO VOTE OF VOTERS TAX AND EXPENDITURE LIMITATIONS. Initiative Constitutional Amendment. Limits State expenditures; restricts use of defined surplus revenue to tax reductions, refunds, or emergencies. Constitutionally eliminates personal income tax for lower income persons, reduces others' 1973 tax up to 20% from surplus, and reduces subsequent year rates 71/2%. Requires two-thirds legislative vote for new or changed State taxes. Limits local property tax rates except school districts'. Requires State funding of new programs mandated to local govern ments. Provides for tax and expenditure limit ŶES adjustments when functions transferred. Contains special indebtedness obligation provisions. Allows local tax rate and expenditure 1 limit increases upon voter approval. Summary of legislative analyst financial impact estimate: \$170,000,000 annual reduction in State tax revenues and probable undeterminable fu-NO ture revenue reductions; reduction in projected State program expenditures of estimated \$620,000,000 in first year to \$1,366,000,000 in fourth year and increasing thereafter, with probable substantial offsetting cost and tax increases to local government. The initiative provision exempting certain low income persons from income taxes and granting a onetime 20% credit on 1973 income taxes for all taxpayers has been accomplished by legislation passed August 23, 1973, granting low income persons exemptions and granting others a 1973 tax credit ranging from 20 to 35%.

SUBJECT: California Ballot

The 1972 California ballot contains twenty-two propositions. Bob Finch has researched all of the propositions, and at my request, provided his recommendations for your consideration and guidance. (Sample ballot attached)

- 1. FOR BONDS TO PROVIDE PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE FACILITIES YES Not a Direct Tax.
- 2. FOR BONDS TO PROVIDE HEALTH SCIENCE FACILITIES AGAINST Locked Just to the University of California.
- 3. <u>ENVIRONMENTAL POLLUTION BOND AUTHORIZATION</u> YES Help Business.
- 4. <u>LEGISLATIVE REORGANIZATION</u> YES
- 5. <u>SCHOOL DISTRICTS</u> YES Local autonomy for local schools.
- 6. <u>MISCELLANEOUS CONSTITUTIONAL REVISIONS</u> <u>YES</u> Clean-up provision for State Constitution.
- 7. <u>ELECTIONS AND PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY</u> YES Based on 26th Amendment.

- 8. <u>TAX EXEMPTION FOR ANTI-POLLUTION FACILITIES</u> <u>YES</u> Helps Business.
- 9. <u>BOND VOTE FOR STRUCTURALLY UNSAFE SCHOOL BUILDINGS</u> YES Need following earthquake. Intended to correct damages caused by the earthquake.
- BLIND VETERANS TAX EXEMPTION

 YES
 Affects only 800 Veterans.
- 11. <u>RIGHT OF PRIVACY</u> <u>YES</u> Controversial.
- 12. DISABLED VETERANS TAX EXEMPTION YES
- 13. WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION YES
- $\frac{\text{TAXATION}}{\text{NO}}$

Controversial. This is the Watson Amendment and would obliterate the advantages of Revenue Sharing.

- 15. <u>STATE EMPLOYEE SALARIES</u> NO Provides no veto power for Governordisrupts the system of checks and balances.
- 16. HIGHWAY PATROL SALARIES NO Same reason as #15
- 17. <u>DEATH PENALTY</u> YES
- $\frac{18. \quad OBSCENITY}{NO}$

Admirable purpose but poorly drawn lawnebulous. Will probably pass anyway.

19. <u>MARIJUANA</u> NO

- 20. <u>COASTAL ZONE CONSERVATION</u> NO Controversial. Admirable purpose but poorly drawn law - creates additional level of bureaucracy.
- 21. ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS TO SCHOOLS YES Busing. ("Yes" vote against busing)
- 22. AGRICULTURAL LABOR RELATIONS YES Chavez urging negative vote.
