The Presidential Preference Committee of the State of Wisconsin has certified to the Secretary of State your name as a Republican candidate for the office of President of the United States.

Your name will appear on the April 4, 1972 Republican presidential preference ballot unless you file a disclaimer stating, without qualification, that you are not and do not intend to become a candidate for the office of President of the United States at the forthcoming presidential election. The disclaimer must be filed no later than February 29, 1972 with the Secretary of State by registered mail, telegram or in person.

If it is your intention to become a candidate, you may file a full list of district and at-large delegates and alternates with the Secretary of State no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 14, 1972. If you do not file this list and you are the winning candidate at the April 4 election, the state party organization will select the list of delegates for your approval, this list to be filed in this office by June 5, 1972.
