D: I have talked to Gromyko and I sent your message.

K: Have you seen the messages we gave you.

D: Not yet.

K: Not in your hands?

D: No.

K: If I kill some people and get the bodies to you can you get them out of the city.

D: HA. HA. HA.

K: You got the message we have Israeli assurance no pre-emptive attack.

D: Yes. I already have passed that along.

K: The messages that are coming to you are overtaken by events.

D: I have already passed your message and Scowcroft to Moscow.

K: So you are up to date. I have talked to the Egyptian For. Min. and passed on the Israeli message to him. I have also told him about the Israeli assurance that there would be no pre-emptive attack and that we will see to it that that is carried out. He told me he would communicate this urgently to Cairo. We have not been in touch with the Syrians. That is the weak point in this situation.

D: I understand.

K: Our influence in Syria is not as good as it is in Jerusalem.

D: I understand.

K: You can pass that on to Moscow in case they don't know it.
That is about all we have done.

D: All has been done as you have directed me.

K: Accept that we have talked to the Egyptian For. Min. about it.

D: You spoke with him on the telephone.

K: He is in N. Y. We had a good conversation in N. Y. Yesterday
we had a friendly meeting but inconclusive. As I told you we I told
you, we are not going to play any games. You will be told what we
do. You can reassure Moscow on that point.

D: You will be back in Washington.

K: Yes.

D: When in Washington.

K: Tomorrow night unless this gets out of control.
