

over to LA RUE \$22,000 amount to pay for an advertising expenditure that HALDEMAN had incurred. He said after that he turned over about \$40,000 to LA RUE and then turned over a balance of approximately \$288,000 to LA RUE. He turned over this money to LA RUE in his apartment which was also in the Watergate. He said he had not been given money for attorneys fees. He said that JOHN DEAN was his attorney until two weeks previous. He had no direct knowledge that LA RUE after June 17, 1972, was in charge of distributing of money to the defendants but he "suspected it". He admitted that MAGRUDER had told him about an occasion when LIDDY supposedly shot out a street light that was interfering with contemplated entry into Mc Govern Headquarters. He said after June 17, 1972, he "shredded" all the documents showing covert activity which he had in his possession. He pointed out he maintained his own files, however, STRACHAN at this point still maintained he had no knowledge prior to June 17, 1972, that the Democratic National Headquarters was being bugged.

STRACHAN was then afforded a second polygraph examination on 4/21/73. Again there was so much body movement that the series was halted and began again. The relevant questions asked during this series and STRACHAN's answers are as follows:

4. Prior to June 17, 1972, did you know for certain that the Democratic National Committee was being bugged? Answer - No.
6. Did HALDEMAN ever tell you he knew of the Watergate bugging before June 17th? Answer - No.
7. Before June 17, 1972, did HALDEMAN ever tell you LIDDY was bugging the Democratic Headquarters? Answer - No.
9. After June 17, 1972, did HALDEMAN give you direct orders to destroy evidence of LIDDY's covert activity? Answer - No.
11. Have you deliberately given a false answer to any of these questions? Answer - No.

There were emotional responses to questions four, seven (when the question was repeated during the series) and 11. At this point STRACHAN was told it appeared that he still had knowledge prior to June 17th that the Democratic Committee was being bugged. He admitted that circumstantial evidence surrounding this would be difficult to believe that he did not
