War on Cancer

Scope and Content Note

The Nixon Library has compiled the following list of textual materials, photos, and recordings relating to the War on Cancer during the Nixon Administration.

A report filed by the panel of Consultants on the Conquest of Cancer with authorization from the Committee on Labor and Public Welfare in the Senate titled "A National Program for the Conquest of Cancer" found that cancer was the number one health concern of Americans in 1970 and outlined several recommendations for a nationwide cancer program. Biomedical and cancer research organizations such as the Lasker Foundation, under Mary Lasker, lobbied for the report and played a significant role in bringing the importance of cancer research to the attention of the Nixon administration.

Starting with his second State of the Union address on January 22, 1971 and drawing on the recommendations made in the report, President Nixon announced his intention to make the conquest of cancer a national priority. During this State of the Union, he promised \$100 million for cancer research, which he then reaffirmed in his statement to the nation on May 11, 1971 regarding the "Cancer Cure Program". On the same day, Senators Dominick and Griffin introduced S. 1848, the National Cancer Act of 1971, on behalf of the Nixon administration. Other bills had been introduced in both the Senate and the House of Representatives prior to S. 1848 including a bill by Senator Edward Kennedy regarding a national cancer program, but these did not pass due to lack of support or insufficient time for voting.

On December 23, 1971 Nixon signed into law the National Cancer Act of 1971 in a signing ceremony attended by members of the House and Senate and those involved in the creation and passage of the legislation (a clip of the President's remarks and the signing ceremony is available here: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=E2dzEDnGqHY). The bill somewhat controversially allowed the NCI budget to bypass NIH or Department of Health administrators, instead going directly to the president and elevating the NCI within the NIH. The NCI director, as well as National Cancer Advisory Board members and the President's Cancer Panel, would be appointed by the president and would report directly to him. Additionally, the National Cancer Act created the National Cancer Program which would be developed by the NCI director and reviewed by the President's Cancer Panel. Under the Nixon administration Benno Schmidt was appointed chairman of the President's Cancer Panel thanks in part to his earlier experience on the panel of Consultants on the Conquest of Cancer, while Frank Rauscher was named Director of the National Cancer Institute.

Throughout this period, letters and petitions came to the White House personally imploring Nixon to increase cancer research to find the cure for cancer. Many also thanked him for personally overseeing the program on behalf of those affected by the "Dread Disease." Starting in 1969 and continuing throughout the Nixon presidency, President and Mrs. Nixon participated in events hosted by the American Cancer Society and each received several awards for their commitment to cancer research. The National Cancer Act of 1971 is considered to be the beginning of the War on Cancer, although it was never referred to as such in the actual

legislation or by the Nixon administration.

This finding aid includes material such as: memoranda regarding the National Cancer Act of 1971, including pros and cons about the legislation and other bills regarding cancer funding; recommendations for appointees to the President's Cancer Panel and National Cancer Advisory Board; letters from citizens regarding cancer research and the cure for cancer, including responses from the president's office; petitions from citizens calling for increased cancer research; newspaper articles about cancer victims and survivors as well as cancer research; film and audio for press conferences and events (often with the American Cancer Society) regarding the "Cancer Cure Program" and the National Cancer Act of 1971; clips from TV news coverage; photographs of American Cancer Society events, meetings, and the signing of the National Cancer Act.

- how the War on Cancer began, including early legislation and recommendations regarding the structure of the National Cancer Act and Cancer Cure Program
