Part of a conversation between President Nixon and H. R. Haldeman in the Oval Office between 1:30 pm and 2:04 pm on April 19, 1971.

Conversation No. 482-11

Haldeman: Couple of kids from William and Mary there with, uh --

President: Yeah.

Haldeman: -- peace signs, but even they weren't very --.

President: They had one little kid asked me, a teenager, "How does it feel to be a war criminal?"

Haldeman: Really?

President: I just, I just smiled at him, went around, you know, just ignored him. That kills these little bastards. They just came now to be paying attention to, ya know --.

Haldeman: Yeah.

President: That's my theory. My feeling is don't pay attention to 'em. That's where I disagree with Garment and Finch and Rumsfeld. Christ, they [unintelligible] and rap with 'em. Whaddya mean rap with [unintelligible]? What the Christ are they talkin' about?
