President: Uh, I mean, uh, what I did or didn't do on Wounded Knee, uh, wasn't going to make or break the country. You know it was very important to do it right, and it was done well. Unfortunately, we didn't get much credit, because it was done at a time that, uh, other things were happening that was [sic] bigger news.
