Processing History: The collection had been partially processed by Susan Naulty, prior to September 2003. The collection was arranged and described, and fully processed with preservation by Richard Nixon Library and Birthplace archive staff.

Biography

Herman L. Perry was born in 1884 in Westfield, Indiana. In January, 1906, Mr. Perry migrated to Whittier, California. In 1907 he became a bookkeeper at the First National Bank in Whittie, and stayed for 42 years, during which time the bank became the Whittier Branch of The Bank of America. Mr. Perry served as Vice President in 1930 until he retired in 1949. In 1910 he married Lola C. Carver.

In 1946, Mr. Perry and citizens committee formed to find and support a candidate for Congress. They contacted Richard Nixon asking if he was interested in challenging incumbent Congressman Jerry Voorhis for the 12th District of California congressional seat. At Mr. Perry's suggestion, Richard Nixon, still on duty in the Navy following World War II, flew from Baltimore to appear before the committee, and subsequently received its unanimous endorsement. Richard Nixon was elected to the House of Representatives in November 1946.

Mr. Perry was a member of the Republican State Central Committee, the United Republican Finance Committee, and the Los Angeles County Republican Assembly, and he served as a Delegate to the State Convention of the Republican Party in 1952. He led an active life in the community until his death in 1954, becoming a high school trustee for nine years, serving on the Whittier College Board of Trustees for 31 years, five years as president, and was a member of the Finance Committee for 30 years and Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the First Friends Church of Whittier for 10 years. He also served as a member of the Whittier Chamber of Commerce for 40 years, leading as president for one year, and was president of the Lions Club of Whittier for a year.

Hubert C. Perry grew up in Whittier, attending high school and Whittier College graduating with an AB in 1935. In 1937 he received an MBA from Stanford University. Upon graduation from Stanford he worked in the Accounting department of Bullock's for one year. In 1939 he joined the Bank of America and became Regional Vice President in 1971 until he retired in 1973.

Mr. Hubert Perry worked with his father in various Nixon political campaigns. He was involved in other campaigns, such as the re-election of Governor EarlWarren campaign in 1950. After his father's death in 1954, Mr. Hubert *Perry* became one of Richard Nixon's political advisors, working on the Nixon presidential campaigns.

Mr. Hubert Perry became active in Whittier Community affairs, becoming Treasurer and Trustee of the Presbyterian Intercommunity Hospital in Whittier, Trustee of the Richard M. Nixon Foundation, Trustee of Whittier College, and past president of the Whittier Ana Chamber of Commerce, Whittier College Alumni Association and the Whittier Lions Club. He also worked with the Whittier Nixon Foundation.

In 1972 Mr. Perry donated papers to the Richard Nixon Foundation, and they were accepted in 1973 for eventual deposit in the Richard Nixon Presidential Library. He currently serves as a Board member of the private Richard Nixon Library and Birthplace Foundation.
