11:10 a.m. Secretary Resor reads a brief and generalized Medal of Honor Citation. It will not include any details with regard to specific deeds performed by the recipients.

Accompanied by Major Brennan, you move to the first family group to the right of the platform and present the Medal of Honor. You will pose for a photograph with the group to be taken by Ollie Atkins.

The name of the next recipient will be announced by the appropriate Service Secretary. The Citation will not be read a second time. After the name is announced, you move to the next family group and repeat the presentation as before and continue until all presentations are completed.


