

BARBARA MCCLINTOCK, Distinguished Service Member, Carnegie Institution of Washington, Cold Spring Harbor, Long Island, New York, "For establishing the relations between inherited characters in plants and the detailed shapes of their chromosomes, and for showing that some genes are controlled by other genes within chromosomes".

GEORGE E. MUELLER, Senior Vice President, General Dynamics Corporation, 1 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, N. Y., "For his many individual contributions to the design of the Apollo System, including the planning and interpretation of a large array of advanced experiments necessary to insure the success of this venture into a new and little known environment".
