MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT
FROM ROSE MARY WOODS

You will recall Dona Mason (used to sing at the old Colony Club in Washington). She called this morning - she works in Leisure World and is anxious to do anything she can to help with the people of Mexican background during the election.

She asked that I give you her best - also she says you are doing a wonderful job.

One point she thinks we are missing -- we keep calling these people Mexican-Americans and she thinks we should work our public relations people overtime and get this changed. The ones who want to be Mexicans can go back to Mexico -- these people want to be Americans -- and want to be called Americans. This is going to be a tough, uphill battle for these votes and she would like to help.
