SUBJECT: Value Added Tax

The February 10, 1972 News Summary contained the following paragraph:

---HHH charges that if RN is re-elected he will try to slap a value-added or giant national sales tax on the people. "That's exactly what's in the works." He said such a tax would add 3-5% to the cost of goods. And he said ultimately it will be used to reduce the taxes of the wealthy. He suggested that RN could raise \$18B a year by closing loopholes. --

It was requested that you note the political danger of the Value Added Tax as reflected in this comment from Humphrey.
