It's great to hear from you. One of the best parts of this job is hearing from old friends from school and the service that I've lost track of.

I don't recall seeing you in England but I was at Bungay with the 446th in B-24s. I was on a lead crew and flew so seldom that I was still there at V-E Day.

I went back to UCLA and on to Stanford Law School. We got married in law school and I turned down California jobs and went to Seattle where another attorney and I started a practice. We got pretty well settled down there in 18 years and the move here was quite a wrench for all of us.

We have 5 children -- 3 boys and 2 girls -- who this week are scattered all over the country from Alaska to California to Colorado. Our youngsters look to be about the same ages as yours.

If you find yourself down this way, I hope you'll let me know you're coming so that we can get together.

Dear John:

For the past several weeks I have been meaning to write you and finally the opportunity presents itself. Early in the year I caught a TV newscast in which reference was made to a 'John Ehrlichman, advisor to the President' and I said to Janet 'that can't be the same John Ehrlichman I knew in the service - or could it'. After one of the national newsmagazines carried your picture I knew it had to be.

With the time passage of some 26-27 years, I can't remember exactly when and where we were in the Air Force together but do recall that it was in the Aviation Cadet program we met. You were a Navigator and I was a Bombardier and I imagine we were grouped somewhere along the line because of the alphabetical sequence of our last names. I remember your home was in Santa Ana, Calif. and it was typical Army luck that you weren't assigned to the Cadet base there instead of to Texas. The article I read about you recently said you now lived in Seattle.

I dug out my old Army foot-locker and went through some of the old class books from pre-flight, gunnery, etc., to see if it would identify where we met but had no success. I did come across an old dusty letter which you had sent me from Davis-Monthan Field in Arizona when we were in crew training and I was at Colorado Springs on the way to being transferred to Mountain Home, Idaho. I also have a vague recollection of having biked over to your base in England but can't remember if you were in 17's or 24's. I was in the latter with the 93rd BG at Hardwicke. After losing my original crew after 11 missions I rotated to other lead crews until we were finally shot up over Hamburg on my 20th and were interned in Sweden in Jan. '45. That, as you can well imagine, was a very lucky break.

After the war, I came back to Madison and finished my Senior year at the UW in Marketing and Advertising. Went to work for a firm in Chicago and discovered after a short while that I didn't care for the big city. Moved back to Madison and have been here ever since with

As you can see from the enclosed copy of our Christmas card from last year, Janet and I are kept from having much idle time by trying to raise our family of 5 sons. Believe me when I say it's a challenge !

Enough of my autobiography, John. I know from daily press stories how busy your life must now be. When you have a chance, however, I'd very much like to hear some background on how you came out of the War; what you did afterwards so far as school and jobs were concerned; the status of your family, etc. Also, if you can shed any light from your recollections on how and where our paths crossed.

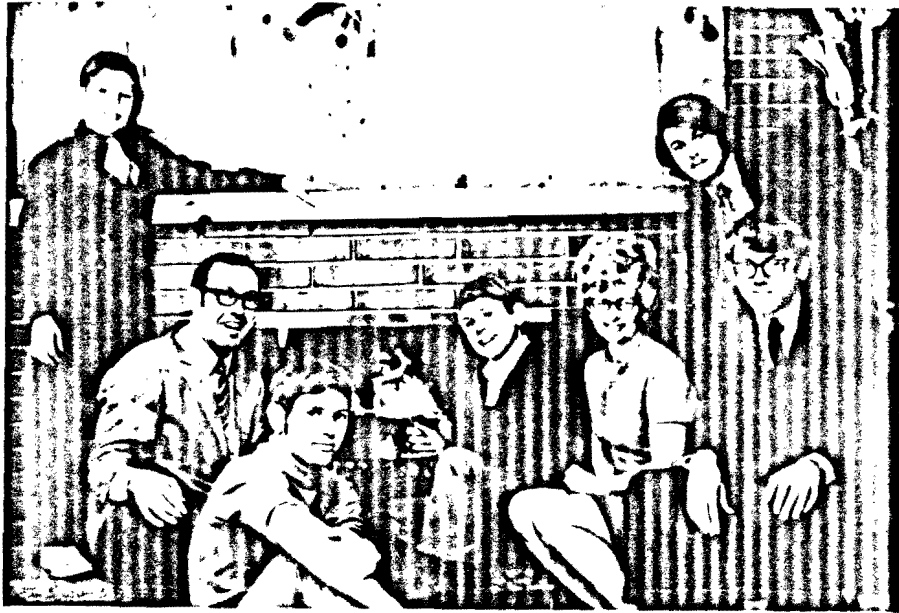
