Sunday, August 22.

I had no contact with the President. He didn't even call through the entire day; did get a long report from Colson, in preparation for a call. He said there isn't much new in the papers, that they're going to start stirring things up again tomorrow, because the story's starting to fizzle out and losing its punch. The Texas situation is in good shape, because the state Attorney General is planning to rule that federal government is right and the Governor wrong, will give appropriate orders to the agencies which will follow them out, and then the Lieutenant Governor on Tuesday will blast the Governor. They have a lot of plans for keeping our people going this week. Good packet for the columnists, follow-up on the polls, etcetera. He feels that the overriding sentiment is strongly with us, all the economists, etcetera, and that we're basically in very good shape.
