Friday, October 8.

President had a full morning schedule, starting with breakfast with Senator Long and running through until time to leave for West Virginia. The appearance there was a little hokey, since it was a "crown the Queen" type ceremony with a long procession to "Pomp and Circumstance" and some pretty cornball coronation proceedings. But the President thoroughly enjoyed it, gave him a good chance to get out with just plain folks, and he did a good job on a purely local, non-substantive talk to them. He then went on to Camp David for the "Fat-Cat" dinner with Kalmbach's group, which apparently went very well in spite of Mulcahy becoming stoned and a little effusive in his praise of the President and his desire to get the money raised.
