Saturday, October 16.

The President was at Camp David, presumably all day, and apparently watched the World Series this afternoon. He did call at 4:30 regarding the World Series and said "I think I'll give up this business and start predicting baseball games." He had predicted the outcome of this game, as he had the third game, very much against the general prognostications.

He'd been reading the mail folder and was interested that there's been no mail about Russia. He said when I'm talking to Chapin in Hawaii, that I should tell him to see that there are times when the President is riding, somewhere in Peking or other places, in the car without Chou. If he moves by himself on some of the trips, he can play it by ear and get some people contact, which is what he's after.
