Saturday, March 4.

President had me over at 10:00 this morning, primarily apparently, just for something to do. He talked a little about schedule plans and basic policies; for example, he's not going to do anything for money in the campaign, no phone calls, meetings, dinners, or anything. He wants to work out plans for his press conference, but doesn't want to conflict with Rogers' testimony on the Hill. Wants to send his China report to Congress on Friday if Congress is there, otherwise put it off till Monday. He discussed the Flanigan problem with the business community and figures more business contacts should be moved to Peterson. I should discuss that with Ehrlichman and Flanigan. He raised Elmer Bobst's thing, since he was here for dinner last night, about dedicating his hospital in New York, and he's not going to do it.

That was about it. Weather was good, and we ended the meeting so he could go on out in the boat with Julie and Bebe.
