Sunday, August 6.

The President in Assateague most of the day, then came into Washington. I'm still in California. He called this afternoon, said-- from Washington, said that he thought the beach weekend was good for John Mitchell, it was a good relief for him, as well as for the President. A problem, because Martha wants to go to the convention and they've got to figure out how to deal with that.

The President feels that we've got to be sure that all our speakers' talks have a proper balance of anti-McGovern material plus pro-Nixon. On the next two weeks, he says we should do anything we can that's really newsworthy and positive. We should really crank up the revenue sharing signing ceremony and get the maximum mileage out of that. We're scheduling a Cabinet meeting at Camp David Tuesday night and he wants to give them plenty of time for their briefing and to ask questions. That was about it.
