Thursday, December 21st. The President at Key Biscayne. He did call during the day, but I was out shopping. I returned the call in the evening, and he had nothing particular in mind, except wanting Ehrlichman to call his brother Ed Nixon about some football deal Ed's trying to put together. I talked to Connally earlier in the day.

He said that King Faisal is really mad about the Jews. That Prince Fayeed said there's no Arab leader who will agree that the status quo can remain. The Jews have to give up their territory. He thinks the US should move now to bring things around.
