Tuesday, April 9.

The President was back on the Julie and David problem again and concerned about how to get at it, because he finds that the York County Chairman, the State Chairman, Scott, and Dent, all say that Julie and David shouldn't be living in the house in Maryland and that, if they're going to run, if he's going to run, that they should move into the District. Wanted me to talk to Bush and try and get the others straightened out and get them off the house kick, and have him follow-up with Scott and Goodling. He also wanted me to have Bush work out the California problem for Finch and wanted Ehrlichman to get going on the yeomen. He thinks we ought to get on a counteroffensive on to counteract Watergate. We had a long discussion about the monitoring facilities in his offices and he wants them all taken out, but then he later changed his mind and said to leave them in on a switch basis. He's obviously concerned about having everything covered and wants to set up some kind of limited means of coverage. I spent most of the day, as usual, working on the Watergate. The President had a fairly involved schedule that kept him otherwise occupied.
