Wednesday, October 29.

Meeting most of morning with AFL-CIO leaders. Afternoon on speech, after long shots with Kissinger, then Ehrlichman, then me.

Evening to New Jersey for Cahill, two stops: Morristown and Hackensack. Typical Jersey political rallies. Good crowds and great enthusiasm. Quite a few peaceniks and few eggs tossed, but overall very good. Cahill a little better candidate than Holton. President again enjoyed it greatly, was talking all the way on the chopper with the Congressman.

Had an hour with the problem Senators regarding Haynsworth in late evening. Harlow says he did very well, and gained some ground. Long talk regarding future schedule and especially plans for Moratorium period. Agreed with recommendation to stay at White House, except for trip down for moon launch.
