Sunday, October 4.

A nice easy day at Kilfrush. Canceled plans for President to go to Waterville - was just too tired. A disappointment to Mulcahy - but he survived and went on down himself. President took nap and worked on papers in the afternoon - morning was meeting of Bruce and Habib. We went to Shannon for shopping.

Then to Dromoland Castle (a hotel) for press reception in late afternoon (by chopper over the green Irish countryside). President did superb job of wrapping up the whole trip and putting together its significance country by country, and as a whole. He was obviously still very tired - but covered the ground very well.

Another Mulcahy dinner - this time just family plus a ringer - Admiral Bergen, here to pitch President and Mulcahy for Navy League dinner for VP. President left the dinner before and called me into den to get Bergen off his back. Then we had Mulcahy in - to promise \$1 to \$2 million for this year's campaigns if we need it. President was overwhelmed. Later had me up to his bedroom to discuss plans of where to put the dough, plus the balance we have available. He's really intrigued with the campaign, and can't understand why our polls show so many of our candidates doing so badly.
