To Members of the Association:

During the past ten years the Association's day-to-day expenses have increased over sixty percent. In the present economic climate it has been necessary for us to adopt a budget for the 1969-1970 fiscal year in which we anticipate a further increase of approximately ten percent.

The Association must continue to increase the scope and effectiveness of its activities if it is to preserve its proud tradition and its responsible place in the community. Indeed, many of the economies we have been forced to adopt are even now beginning to affect adversely our efficiency and the maintenance of our House.

It has long been the policy to keep our dues, which provide over two-thirds of our revenue, reasonable in amount. Rather than to have our dues increased at this time, we believe our members would prefer to make voluntary contributions of ten percent of the amount of their dues. A similar suggestion was well received by the membership in 1961 and it is the Executive Committee's belief that our membership will again respond generously.

The Executive Committee emphasizes that these contributions should be *voluntary* and without any compulsion, moral, social or otherwise. The making of a contribution or the absence of one will be treated as confidential.

In making your contribution, you will have the satisfaction of promoting not only the welfare of the Association but the welfare of our profession.


Had we stayed at our former site, we would have had to practically rebuild the Clubhouse and try to design or rearrange a golf course— all subject to much higher school and real estate taxes.






