**MEMORANDUM**

**TO: SCHEDULE COMMITTEE**  
**FROM: RN**  
**RE: Advancing Trips**

**Make a note that generally speaking after this California trip I think we should avoid trying to do the press at the airport.**

**I think what we had better do - so that we can save them hauling all the equipment out to the airport -- let's try to have the press conference at a time and place convenient downtown.**
