MEMORANDUM FOR : **RAY PRICE**
FROM : **H. R. HALDEMAN**

The President has totally rejected the two letter drafts to Members of Congress, incumbent and non-incumbent. He makes the point that the letter should be briefer, more precise, shorter sentences. He feels the two draft letters attached are utterly terrible and suggests something along the following lines:

"As you enter the final stages of your campaign, I want you to know that I realize how challenging it is as I recall my first race for Congress. We need people of your dedication and ability, and I wish you well."

I don't think he's really thought this one through, but he does feel that it should be done more tightly than the attached drafts.
