
Dear John:





Dear Mr. Hullin:

With regard to our telephone conversation yesterday, I would like to explain more fully the invitation our club is extending Mr. Ehrlichman.

The Young Republicans of King County (YRKC) are planning a luncheon for early March at which we would like our guest, John Ehrlichman, to be the speaker. The topic of his talk, to be chosen by Mr. Ehrlichman, preferably would be one pertinent to the Northwest in 1973 relating the federal government policies and funding to our area.

Those persons attending the luncheon will extend far beyond our own membership to include a broad spectrum of people from the greater Seattle business and professional communities.
