Sunday, July 11.

I didn't go into the office, and there was no contact with the President other than a phone call at 7:50 this morning, when he called, obviously quite pleased, to say that we got the message all right that they agreed on the time for making the joint communiqué, that the meeting has been put off to spring of next year. The thing was very dramatic in that Henry had met with them for seventeen hours, that the communiqué will indicate the meeting, the place—the meeting Henry had that is, and the place that he met—and the participants, so that will really build that part of it up. The game on this, of course, is still to play it mum, no word to anybody. The President will tell Rogers. He kind of chortled then, because he had talked to Billy Graham just before talking to me, and Graham had asked him how Kissinger was feeling, that he was so concerned about his illness, and so on.
